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Dear Friends and Benefactors of Our Lady of Mount Carmel,

It was with great excitement that I am writing to you this autumn. Our Lady of Mount Carmel has received permission from the Superior General to extend its boarding facility! Some years ago, Father Scott decided that OLMC would accept boy boarders. From the initial five boarders, OLMC today has forty-one boy boarders, some of whom are housed in somewhat unsuitable facilities. This past Summer, I had to turn away several boys due to a lack of space. Already for next year, there are seven boys on a waiting list.

Why are we oversubscribed? Firstly, OLMC truly seeks to provides that pearl of great price – a truly Catholic education, that is one where man's true destiny is the goal – the good life of union with God, virtue, academic excellence, maturity and solid habit. Secondly, OLMC is the only SSPX traditional school in Canada that accepts boarders as well as being our only English-speaking school that goes all the way to Grade 12. St. John Bosco School in Calgary which stops at Grade 8 is fast becoming a feeder school for our high school. New Hamburg's proximity to the American border means that we welcome not a few students from both Michigan and Indiana, not to mention those who come from as far away as Kansas, California and even Mexico seeking to learn the true wisdom of life and with it all other good things.

The conclusion is as sure as we can be – Providence wants us to expand so that we can house those boarders we have in more suitable accommodation, and that we can welcome more boarders to give more young people a truly Catholic education in the footsteps of St. John Bosco and of Archbishop Lefebvre.

We plan to build on our current property, which is 5½ acres in size, a sufficient dormitory facility to accommodate all our boarders and more as well as kitchen and refectory facilities and simple recreation space for long Canadian winters. I will write to you before Advent with a full prospectus of what we hope to do and how you might be able to help us practically by donations and loans. In due course, if God wills and the facility is filled, it will pay for itself and allow us to expand and improve our curriculum to better provide for trades and sciences. In the meantime, with your help, we will put our best foot forward. The first thing that we must do is pray because "unless God build the house, they labour in vain who build it" (Ps. 126, 1). We have our special patroness in heaven none

other than the Queen herself, Our Mother of Mount Carmel. To this end, I am suggesting that we have a Rosary Novena to Our Lady for the feast of her Presentation in the Temple.
